**Section 2. Powers and Functions.** The Municipal Peace and Order Council shall have the following duties and functions:

- a. Formulate plans and recommend such measures that will improve or enhance peace and order and public safety in the city;
- b. Monitor the implementation of peace and order projects and the operation of the civilian volunteer defense organizations and such other insurgency programs and activities;
- c. Provide a forum for dialogue and deliberation of major issues and problems affecting peace and order, including insurgency and terrorism; e
- d. Recommend measures to converge and orchestrate internal security operation efforts of civil authorities and agencies, military and police;
- e. Make periodic assessments of the prevailing peace and order situation in the municipality and;
- f. Perform all other functions assigned by law.

**Section 3. Secretariat.** There shall be a Peace and Order Council Secretariat which shall handle the administrative, operation and technical activities of the CPOC. Specifically, the Secretariat shall prepare plans and programs for consideration of the councils, supervise, direct, monitor for the council the implementation of approved polices, programs and plans; undertake liaising and coordination of activities with appropriate agencies of the government and provide a forum for interdisciplinary dialogue and deliberation of major issues and problems affecting peace and order.

The Secretariat shall be composed of the following:



**Section 4. Meetings and Quorum.** The Council shall convene at least once a month. Advance and schedule of meeting will be sent out to all the members by the Secretariat. A majority of the members present shall constitute quorum.

**Section 5. Repealing Clause.** All other order, issuances and memoranda issued inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**Section 6. Effectivity.** This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.

**REORGANIZING THE MUNICIPALITY OF CULION PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL**

**WHEREAS**, the threat to peace and order posed by criminality and terrorism requires the dedicated efforts of all government official and citizens;

**WHEREAS**, government efforts at peace and order need to be fully coordinated to effectively prevent and suppress criminality and to maintain public order and safety in the land;

**WHEREAS**, it is the duty of local governments, the law enforcement agencies, the prosecution services, and similar institutions of government operating in the locality to assist the local chief executive in the proper enforcement of the laws and the administration of justice;

**WHEREAS**, the participation of the citizenry in peace and order is of critical importance;

**WHEREAS**, Section 116 of the Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991", mandates local government units to establish a local peace and order council pursuant to Executive Order Numbered Three Hundred Nine (E.O. No. 309), as amended, Series of 1988, wherein the local peace and order council shall have the same composition and functions as those prescribed in the said executive order.

**WHEREAS**, Section 1 (d) of EO 309 provides that the Municipal Peace and Order Council shall be composed of the municipal counterparts of the departments, offices and agencies as enumerated in paragraph (a) of the said executive order, wherever applicable, to be appointed by their respective agency heads, with the Municipal Mayor as Chairman. In addition, there shall be one representative of the Sangguniang Bayan, as the case may be, to be chosen by said Sangguniang from among its members. The Chairman of the Municipal Peace and Order Council shall appoint the three (3) representatives of the private sector, upon consultation with the members of the Council. Departments, offices and agencies with no municipal and/or field offices may deputize their representatives on the municipal levels.

**WHEREFORE**, I, **MA. VIRGINIA N. DE VERA**, Municipal Mayor of Culion, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law and the sovereign will of people, do hereby order:

Section 1. Composition. The Culion Peace and Order Council is hereby reconstituted to be composed of the following:
